We created **#TheNetBenefit**, a nonpartisan education campaign, because we know that when Missourians' basic needs are not met, their health is negatively impacted. We wanted to inform Missourians about how taking care of our residents who most need help leads to stronger communities and a stronger state.

Now, as our state leaders start to gear up for the 2020 legislative session, and as safety net debates continue to unfold at the federal level, we want to ensure that the basic needs of every day Missourians remain at the center of the conversation.

This e-toolkit is designed to help you incorporate this important message throughout September, during our campaign push. It includes social media posts and graphics, and newsletter copy you can use or adapt.

To further amplify this important message, we placed **full-page print ads** in newspapers across the state, including:

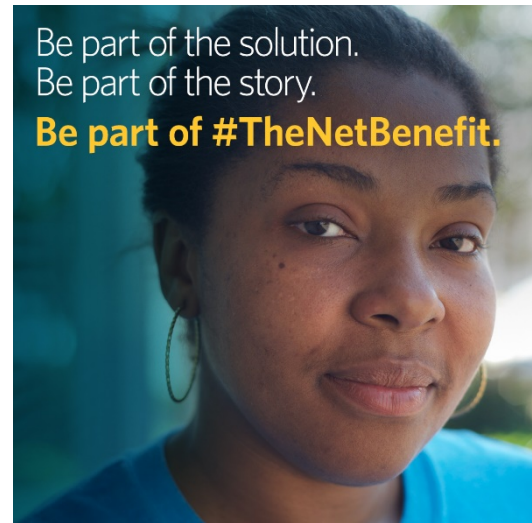

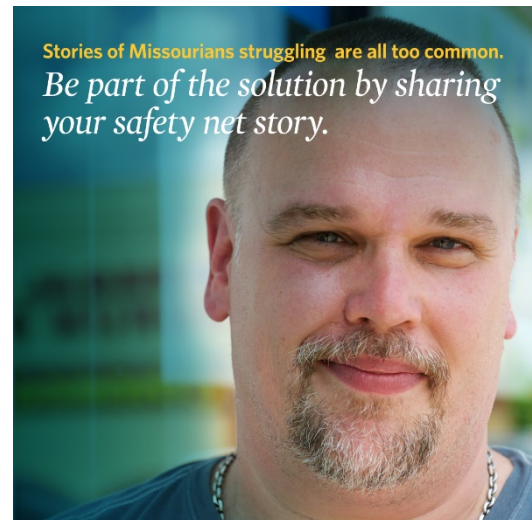
